Beginning Stained Glass - \$75 March 4, Thursdays 4 weeks 6:00 – 8:30pm

In this class you will make a small panel using one of many patterns the studio provides. You will learn to cut glass using a number of techniques, learn how to use special tools designed for stained glass artists and construct your panel using the copper foil technique.

Glass Club - March 6, Saturday 10:30am

We will continue with last year's format of Zoi providing a project on the first Saturday during odd months and everyone bringing in works in progress during even months. We also have a few ideas for field trips we can enjoy this year. The club provides the opportunity to share techniques, learn new ones and jam about our favorite hobby/art form. Join us for another informative and fun year.

Leaded Window – \$75 March 6, Saturdays 4 weeks 10:30am - 12:30pm

Learn how to construct windows using lead came and zinc. We'll discuss reinforcement using rebar and appropriate designs for leaded windows. You will need a soldering iron (with a rheostat if it is an uncontrolled iron), lead cutter, glass cutter, breaking pliers and glass supplies for your window. *Beginning Stained Glass is required.*

Stepping Stone - \$45 March 9, Tuesdays 2 weeks 6:00 - 8:00 pm

What a great opportunity to make stepping stones to enjoy the rest of the summer! Prepare ahead of time by choosing a pattern and glass before the first day of class. We'll use the first week to cut and grind glass and pour your stone the 2nd week. You may use Diamondcrete, Flashcrete or concrete for your stone. Diamondcrete and Flashcrete set up in 1 hour and concrete needs rebar and 2-3 days to cure.

Beginning Fusing Techniques - \$75 March 23, Tuesdays 3 weeks 6:00 - 8:00 pm

This class introduces you to terms, firing schedules and hands-on experience with glass fusing. We'll cover glass cutting techniques for those of you who haven't taken a stained glass class and follow that with a firing demonstration for small jewelry pieces. Weeks 2 and 3 will include techniques and firing schedules for fusing and slumping plates or bowls. Students will fire their own pieces during class time or at their convenience. ***The third class will be held on Wednesday, April 7th.**

Fused Picture Frame - \$25 March 31, Wednesday 6:00 – 8:30pm

Make a picture frame using an inexpensive metal frame, fusible glass and nuggets or dichroic shapes. We'll show you how to set up the cut pieces for the frame and run the firing schedule. Then we'll attach the glass to the metal frame and you'll have a cool picture frame.

All prices are for tuition ONLY unless otherwise stated. Please bring your own tools and materials or purchase them at the time of the class. Grinders, cutting surfaces and Morton System are provided.

Color and Design – \$45 April 1 (no foolin'), Thursdays 2 weeks 6:00 – 8:30pm

If you have difficulty with color and design we can help. This class consists of the discussion of formal artistic concepts, looking at the masters and critiquing various designs. You will learn what makes a good design and how color works. If you're working on a glass design you can bring it in for feedback. During the second week we will go on a field trip to a local church to view their old stained glass windows. Materials for the class consist of any designs you are working on and an enthusiasm for the art of glass.

Garden Obelisk or Garden Spinner – \$55 April 14, Wednesdays 3 weeks 6:00 - 8:00pm

The classical stone obelisk has been given a contemporary update with this whimsical use of traditional copper plumbing parts and stained glass. A specific pattern has not been drawn up for this project but an array of ideas is available for you to choose from. The garden spinner uses copper plumbing parts like the obelisk but we'll do a little pipe bending and add a round stained glass panel that spins when the wind blows. Learn to sweat copper pipes for the stand and add nuggets, tooled metal embellishments and curled wire to enhance your panel.
